Maggie Needs a Miracle

Twelve-year-old **Maggie (Tian Xin Xin)** was born with a complex heart condition and has been a part of our **Shepherd's Field** family since she was 16 months old. She's been one of our Little Lambs for more than a decade! Earlier this year, she was diagnosed with acute renal failure, and for the last 30-plus weeks she's bravely endured dialysis treatments at a hospital in Tianjin. We almost lost her recently, but Maggie's a fighter, and she wants to live. However, her organs are failing, and she's in critical need of both a heart and kidney transplant.

Please pray with us for Maggie as this precious young girl needs a miracle. Maggie is our daughter, our sister and our friend, and we'll do whatever it takes to see her get well again – but in order to do that, we desperately need your help. The cost of her hospitalization and dialysis is extremely expensive – **US\$1,500 (¥10,000 RMB)** per week. Please keep in mind that in order

They really rocked the house – especially when Hector did his solo wheelchair-spin dance moves! Then there was the crowd favorite, the **SFCV Fashion Show**, complete with our own runway. What a thrill to see our kids dressed to the nines! The costumes, the catwalk moves, the music and the pure showmanship made it a natural crowd-pleaser.

This year, many kids who hadn't previously performed for Children's Day participated – and loved it! **Leonard (Ling Dai Wei)** and **Tyler (Rao Han Dong)** played bells and bongos to Woody's "Round Up" from *Toy Story*. **Aubrey (Rao Xia Chen)** took part in both the ribbon-twirling performance and the sign language rendition of "Twinkle, Twinkle, Little Star." **Lydia (Yangxi Zi Nan)** beamed as she twirled away in the ribbon dance.

Our preschool teacher, **Carm**, did a performance with her students showing their morning classroom ritual. To watch these little two-somethings brush their teeth to the beat of the music was a sight to see! Some of our interns, volunteers and guests also performed – including **Billy Chin**, a magician from Beijing.

Before saying “zai jian” though, we celebrated our young superstars with a stellar send-off, complete with all the trimmings! We were proud of the maturity and composure that



Follow Up by Therapy Team

In early June, the orphanage in Dachang invited our staff to teach them how to properly care for **Maya**. When our team visited, they were tremendously encouraged by the amount of one-on-one attention the children received. The aiyis were *eager* to learn how to position and feed Maya correctly. Also, our Occupational Therapist taught the aiyis, then supervised them in spoon-feeding,

thickening liquids, eating puffs and appropriate transfers. We’re confident that Maya and the two boys will flourish in their new home – and despite their absence, all three are still part of our big Shepherd’s Field Family. *Cody, Francis and Maya, we love you and miss you. You are forever in our hearts!*
